Notice to Insured

(Pursuant to the provisions of the Insurance Contracts Act 1984)

Your Duty of Disclosure

Before you enter into a contract of general insurance with us, you have a duty, under the Insurance Contracts Act 1984, to disclose to us every matter that you know, or could reasonably be expected to know, is relevant to our decision whether to insure you, and if so, the terms and conditions on which we will insure you.

You have this duty until we agree to insure you.

You have the same duty to disclose those matters to us before you renew, extend, vary or reinstate a contract of general insurance.

Information you do not need to give

Your duty, however, does not require disclosure of any matter:

- that reduces the risk to be undertaken by us;
- that is of common knowledge;
- that we already know or should know in the ordinary course of our business as an insurer;
- that has been indicated by us as not necessary for us to know.

Non-disclosure

If you fail to comply with your duty of disclosure, we may be entitled to reduce our liability under the contract in respect of a claim, or may cancel the contract. If your non-disclosure is fraudulent, we may also have the option of voiding the contract from its beginning.

- > To reinsurers or reinsurance brokers (which may include reinsurers located outside of Australia).

Where we do disclose the information as above the recipient may hold the information in accordance with its own privacy statement / policies. Full details can be found on the recipient's website. However, we can also provide a copy to you on request.

We may also be required to provide your personal information to others for purposes of public safety and law enforcement and if required by law or by a law enforcement body to do so.

You may request access to your personal information, and where necessary, correct any errors in this information (some restrictions and costs may apply).

By completing and returning the proposal form and/or providing us with any additional information in connection with your application, you agree to us using and disclosing your information as set out above. This consent to the use and disclosure of your personal information remains valid unless you alter or revoke it by giving us written notice.
